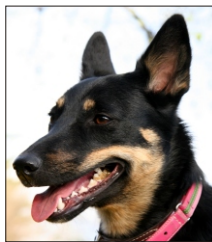

Kinetic Art Exhibition

Russ is busy in the studio creating a series of interactive neon sculptures for an installation called the **Positronic Neural Network** for the MomentuM show at Grounds for Sculpture, Hamilton, NJ. The exhibition will be on display May 13-September 24, and the opening reception will be Friday May 13, 2-6 p.m.

Like Russ's sculpture that was installed at the Washington University School of Medicine last November, the vintage neon incorporated into the sculpture will light up as viewers walk through the installation.

New Directions for Uncommon Threads

Pam is finishing up her biggest art quilt ever on her new machine that she won at the Viking Husqvarna Exhibition last November. **Towers of Babble** will be one of four of her quilts in the Uncommon Threads show at the Springfield Art Museum on exhibit April 21-June 4.

The exhibition will feature over 40 contemporary art quilts by Uncommon Threads, a group of 15 regional fiber artists that meet every month at RuBert Studios. Stop by the Art Museum for a preview reception Friday evening, April 21 from 5-7 p.m. to meet the artists.

Art Quilts in Philadelphia

Pam's quilt **Whine and Dine at Sushi Zen** will be part of Art Quilts at the Sedgwick in Philadelphia from April 7-May 21. After that, the quilt will travel to Quilting Arts Magazine where it will be photographed for an article in the September 2006 issue.

PBS Documentary

Early in March a crew from Wisconsin Public Television videotaped interviews with Pam at work in her studio for an art quilt documentary. The producer Laurie Gorman has already produced two quilt documentaries called **America Quilts** and **A Century of Quilts**, and this new program will be broadcast on PBS the spring of 2007.
